Josh Funk writes silly stories and somehow tricks people into publishing them as books — such as the Lady Pancake & Sir French Toast series (including The Case of the Stinky Stench and Mission Defrostable), How to Code a Sandcastle (and the upcoming sequel How to Code a Rollercoaster), It's Not Jack and the Beanstalk, Dear Dragon, Albie Newton, Pirasaurs!, Lost in the Library: A Story of Patience and Fortitude (in conjunction with the New York Public Library), It's Not

Hansel and Gretel, and more coming soon! Since fall 2015, Josh has visited (or virtually visited) more than 300 schools, classrooms and libraries. He is a board member of The Writers' Loft in Sherborn, Mass., and was the co-coordinator of the 2016 and 2017 New England Regional SCBWI Conferences. Josh grew up in New England and studied Computer Science in school. He still lives in New England and when not writing Java code or Python scripts, he drinks Java coffee and writes manuscripts.

Erin Soderberg Downing reads and writes books for kids. She loves writing (and reading!) stories that make you laugh, and usually finds inspiration for her stories in everyday stuff — her family, her dog, and things that have happened to her in real life! She loves to travel, explore, read and be outside in nature. These are a few of her other favorite things: playing with her kids and dog; going out to eat at fun restaurants (she loves Ethiopian and Thai food, tacos, and cake!);

swimming in lakes; sledding and skiing; spending time with friends and family; watching movies (her favorite is Elf!); and napping. Erin has spent time as a waitress, a malt-maker, a tour guide on a boat, a book editor, a cookie inventor, a movie extra, and she also worked for Nickelodeon. 4/5 Author: Kirby Larson (www.kirbylarson.com)



Kirby Larson is the acclaimed author of the 2007 Newbery Honor Book, *Hattie Big Sky*, a young adult historical novel she wrote inspired by her great grandmother, Hattie Inez Brooks Wright, who homesteaded by herself in eastern Montana as a young woman. That book, and encouragement from her mentor, Karen Cushman, gave Kirby the confidence to embrace her passion for historical fiction; she has since written the Dogs of World War II series (Scholastic), which include

Duke, Dash (recipient of the Scott O'Dell Historical Fiction Prize), *Liberty* and *Code Word Courage*. Kirby melded her passion for history and mystery in *Audacity Jones to the Rescue* and *Audacity Jones Steals the Show* (nominated for a 2018 Edgar Award). In 2006, Kirby began a collaboration with her good friend, Mary Nethery, which has produced two award-winning nonfiction picture books: *Two Bobbies: A True Story of Hurricane Katrina, Friendship and Survival* (illustrated by Jean Cassels) and *Nubs: The True Story of a Mutt, a Marine and a Miracle*. They think three is a lucky number, so have their eyes peeled for another project to tackle together. A frequent speaker, Kirby enjoys sharing her passion for research, reading and writing. She has presented at more than 200 schools, workshops and seminars in more than 20 states and as far away as Qatar, Lebanon and Guam. Her passport is up to date and she's ready for her next adventure! Kirby lives in Kenmore, Wash., with her husband Neil. When she's not reading or writing, Kirby can be found beachcombing or bird watching with Winston the Wonder Dog.
